Audrey Peterson, Sr Project Mgr 25 studio apartments 22 one bedrooms 1 manager bedroom HHH Funded

Doesn't sit higher than 30' at any point on site.

On Bombay will put in sidewalk and a gate (not for use, just emergency)

2 buildings as part of the property is higher.

John from the community - wants more parking as homeless may/will have need of parking. Parking 1 spot for 4 units (30 parking spaces provided)

John - the amphitheatre feature - want to ensure security - hang out area with people hanging out may cause problems.

Penny Lane has regulations in place to ensure safety - can evict people who violate rules.

Next Steps: Funding phase. 50% through construction documents. Hoping to close end of this year with construction to start early next year. Estimate 16 months to build.

Bonnie Bernard suggests they come to a General Board Meeting (November?). Peter to coordinate.

8. Presentation and Discussion: 12831-12841 W. Maclay Street ZA-2018-3331-ELD-SPR. The site is 6.01 acres that has historically been used for institutional/nursing home use. The facility was built in 1963 and originally approved for, operating as, a 260-bed convalescent care/nursing home. Currently, the 50,200 sf. building is operating as a Skilled Nursing Facility licensed for 141-beds. The Project is now requesting an Eldercare Facility Unified Development Permit. They propose to demolish the 3,873 sf., one-family dwelling on the northern section and construct a new 70,205 sf., 107-room Eldercare Facility in the A1-1 Zone. With Assisted Living on two floors and Alzheimer's/Dementia Care on a one-story section. 45 surface parking spaces will be provided.
