1. 6:00 p.m. Call to Order.
2. Present: Louis Perry, Becky Bascom, Jim Schopper. Unexcused: Cat Barik-Sweeney and Marietta Sue Welch.
3. Vision and Goals. Committee voted unanimously to adopt the attached Vision and Goals and Action Plan.
4. Sub-Committee Reports:
  - Becky reported that the Neighborhood Clean-up was a success! 50+ in attendance, including members of Graffiti Busters, Clean & Green, Phoenix House among others. SNC Board members in attendance were President Tammy Flores and Erica Lopez.
  - Jim drove neighborhoods with Maria Ventura of CD-7 office; resolved some problems and set up schedule to go out monthly. 11 new records were added to file for resolution.
  - Louis reported that the PSAs are going well.
  - 311 Directory mailers -- Louis will check with D.O.N.E. regarding funds available for postage. Tammy suggested back-up plan to pay the Volunteer Center \$200 to hand deliver to the community; she will verify that cost. Also suggested combining distribution of 311 flyers with Outreach.
  - Louis reported that the Ross Liquor clean-up should be complete by 10/10/05.
  - \$100,000 allotment to Sylmar for street resurfacing – Louis reported that he drove with Maria Ventura, and that he is recommending Glenoaks from Hubbard to Polk. Other streets were discussed as problems; consensus was that of the major streets in Sylmar, that section of Glenoaks is the worst. Cheri Blose requested that Louis check on Cobalt as well, as sections of it appear to be unpaved altogether. Louis agreed.
