

DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

The Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation (LA County Parks) manages 183 parks with over 475 sports amenities, operates a network of 6 regional parks, 39 neighborhood parks, 20 community parks, 15 wildlife sanctuaries, 9 nature centers, 39 public swimming pools, more than 240 miles of multi-use trails for hiking, biking, and horseback riding, and the largest municipal golf system in the nation, consisting of 20 golf courses. LA County Parks local and community parks offer a wide variety of parks and amenities such as playgrounds, skateparks, gyms, recreation centers, athletic facilities, dog parks serving unincorporated areas.

The Department also maintains four botanical gardens and two performance venues: The Los Angeles County Arboretum and Botanic Garden, the South Coast Botanic Garden, Descanso Gardens, Virginia Robinson Gardens, Hollywood Bowl and John Anson Ford Amphitheatre providing County residents with valuable recreation and cultural and historic resources and experiences.

To advance its mission and further the health and wellness of unincorporated Los Angeles County communities, LA County Parks offers core programming for children, youth, teens, adults and older adults. Examples of programs include summer camps, after-school programs, youth sports, Our SPOT Teen Centers, contract classes, arts and culture, older adults programming, lunch and snack nutrition programs for youth and families, aquatics and a core and community partnership agreement program.

MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

As federal, state, city, and local governments are facing budget cuts, so are LA County departments, including your LA County Parks. Specifically, LA County Parks is facing a \$22 million budget reduction. Our commitment to public park access, programs, and services remains our top priority as we face budget cuts. I want to assure you that most programs will remain free, however, to address the \$22 million shortfall, we have made some difficult but necessary decisions.

Starting this summer LA County Parks will reduce some programs and services.

- · Our summer pool season that would usually end in October 31 will now end August 16 at our seasonal pools. However, our year-round pools will remain open.
- · We will suspend Parks After Dark but will host summer concerts at selected parks.
- · We will close regional parks on Mondays and Tuesdays, which are our least busy days, a practice used by most museums.
- · We are also reducing part-time staff.

As we navigate this new financial reality, we ask for your understanding and patience as our LA County Park staff continue to serve with dedication and have to do more with less. Our staff will continue to keep our facilities clean and safe for your enjoyment. Additionally, we will still be offering free and affordable most of our programming.

Held on select Fridays in June, July, and August, a total of fifteen camping events will take place at Frank G. Bonelli Regional Park, Castaic Lake State Recreation Area, Kenneth Hahn State Recreation Area, Santa Fe Dam Recreation Area, and Whittier Narrows Recreation Area. The program provides an affordable camping opportunity for families. Each site offering basic amenities such as restrooms, potable water, barbecues, shaded grassy areas, and designated RV camping zones. Admission fees apply to adults over the age of 12 years old.

CONTRACT CLASS PROGRAM

LA County Parks' Contract Class Program builds strong and resilient communities and individuals by offering high quality recreational and enrichment opportunities while also making workforce investments in individuals and businesses local to our parks. Independent contract instructors bring valuable skills and expertise to provide the individuals and families with opportunities to learn new skills, stay active and healthy, and meet new people. Recreation and enrichment classes promote personal well-being among our communities and improve the lives of LA County residents. Programming ranged from a variety of recreation, education wellness and specialty classes. including yoga and meditation, sports skills, dance, fitness, visual arts and performing arts, computer programming and technology, and more.

Contract Class Program creates a nexus in programming with individuals and businesses to offer specialized classes at local parks, recreation and nature centers. LA County Parks provide class instructors with access to amenities including dance and art studios, classrooms, and outdoor spaces, so that the public may benefit from classes and workshops offered at their local parks. Instructors have the flexibility of hosting multiple class offerings on a seasonal basis. Instructors set the times, the number of weeks, registration, and supplies fees, as long as they both remain within the Department's preset programming season, and facilities are available. LA County Parks supports the Contract Class Program by facilitating online participant registration through Active Net. providing access to facilities, supporting an instructor portal to manage class rosters and attendance sheets, and promoting activities to the County's over 10 million residents. The Contract Class program enhances the opportunities for recreation when buildings are already open and staffed.

CORE AND COMMUNITY PROGRAM PARTNERSHIPS

LA County Parks partners with community-based organizations to expand youth access to programming like youth sports, science, technology, engineering, arts, mathematics (STEAM) activities, environmental education, arts and culture, and community service. The Core and Community Partnership Program offers rentals of LA County Parks' facilities to qualified community organizations for no facility use fee or reduced facility use fee, depending on the program or service provided. The use of LA County Parks' facilities by community organizations expands park programming, provides benefits to the public and increases access to park facilities. Through these agreements, LA County Parks forges collaborative partnerships with committed community-based organizations and program providers. Eligible organizations can apply to become a Core Program Partner or a Community Program Partner, depending on the program or service provided, the type of direct benefits provided to LA County Parks, and the scope of partner responsibilities assumed by the organization.

 - Provide free or affordable services
 - Align with DPR Core Programming (as defined by DPR's Business Operations Plan)
- Direct Benefits (Core only, 2 required)
 - · Direct funding of DPR programs and activities
 - Volunteering at DPR core programs or community events
 - Maintenance or improvement of DPR facilities
 - In-kind services, equipment, or other donations
- Partner Responsibilities (Core, all four required; and Community, 2 required)
 - Participate in an annual review meeting
 - Share annual financial records
 - Cross Promote DPR in social media, website, and other promotional channels as a partner
 - Feature DPR and Supervisorial District in program or events and in all related printed and digital promotional materials
